

On 10.07.2013, 1:1 Grey Peacock Pheasant (*Polypectrum bicalcaratum*) and 1:1 Golden Pheasant (*Chrysolophus pictus*) arrived at the park from Alipore Zoo, Kolkata. The pheasants were quarantined for a period of one month and finally kept for display.



SHORT TERM RESEARCH GRANTS

projects on various conservation breeding species aiming towards better scientific management. The park has already completed such research projects on "Behavioural study of Asiatic Black Bear (Ursus thibetanus)", "Standarization of Record keeping in Indian Zoos". Recently one more project on "Study of Snow Leopard (Uncia uncia)" has been completed by Miss Shradhanjali Rai and has submitted her final draft report to Central Zoo Authority. Such research works have contributed towards knowing the species better in captivity and helping towards their scientific well being. The park is currently undergoing research work on "Study of completed Research Project Red panda (Ailurus fulgens) with correlation to insitu study for Conservation **Breeding**" aiming towards correlating the two findings and implementing it towards management of species in captivity and its reintroduction. This work shall be completed on March 2014.





Two more short term research grants have been approved by the Central Zoo Authority, Ministry of Environment and Forest viz: "Red Panda Nutrition: Towards an Integrated Approach" and "Studies on biology, breeding behaviour and aviary practices for performance of captive Himalayan Pheasant".


